JOURNEY OF MIDAS

MIDAS was established in 1982 under the Societies Registration Act 1860 with the support of United States Agency for International Development (USAID). MIDAS was also formally registered with the Department of Social Welfare, Government of Bangladesh as a non-profit voluntary organisation.

Before the registration of MIDAS, a Cooperative Agreement was signed in 1981 between USAID (under its Rural Industrial Project) and The Asia Foundation (as an intermediary) to channel and administer USAID assistance to MIDAS. The registration of MIDAS as an NGO with its clear objectives and vision encouraged USAID to conclude a Cooperative Agreement (CA). The USAID CA, made in 1985, paved the way for providing loan and equity funds to potentially profitable and innovative business ventures. MIDAS became commercially-oriented gradually.

Having been advised by the NGO Cell of the Cabinet Division, Government of Bangladesh, MIDAS Board of Directors reviewed the legal status of MIDAS and decided to form a Company Limited by Guarantee under the Companies Act 1913 with the same mission and mandate. Accordingly, a new company was incorporated on December 30, 1992 under Companies Act 1913 in the name of Micro Industries Development Assistance and Services (MIDAS) and all assets and liabilities of the Society as on April 30, 1993 were transferred to the Company. USAID duly endorsed the transfer.

Financing small enterprises is one of the most important functions of MIDAS. In keeping with the advice of Bangladesh Bank, MIDAS formed a subsidiary company named MIDAS Financing Limited (MFL) in March 1995 that received license in October 1999. MFL started operation in full swing with effect from January 2000 and MIDAS ceased to perform its financing function from the same date. However, MIDAS is continuing to render non-financial business development services. MIDAS is now a leading organisation in the private sector, providing high-quality services to MSMEs and playing a vibrant role in the field of consulting and development in Bangladesh.



Mr. Anjan Chowdhury Chairman, MIDAS Board

Mr. Anjan Chowdhury is a successful businessman of Bangladesh who is best known for his visionary personality. He is one of the key stakeholders of SQUARE GROUP-the leading business conglomerate in Bangladesh. Mr. Chowdhury manages more than 31 ventures of the Group in the capacity of Chairman and Managing Director respectively. Mr. Chowdhury has been recognised by the Government of Bangladesh as a Commercially Important Person (CIP) since 2005 and one of the highest Taxpayers of Bangladesh since 2008 for his continuous contribution to the economic development of the country. Mr. Anjan Chowdhury completed his studies from University of South Florida in Management. He is currently President of the Aviation Operators Association of Bangladesh, President of Association of TV Company Owners (ATCO), Trustee

Member of the Education, Science, Technology and Cultural Development Trust (ESTCDT) of Independent University of Bangladesh, Member of the Luxembourg Business Council, Chairman of Society for the Promotion of Bangladeshi Art (SPBA), President of Annada Gobindo Public Library, Pabna, etc. He is Vice President of Bangladesh Olympic Association (BOA) and a Councilor and Former Vice President of Bangladesh Football Federation (BFF), Councilor of Bangladesh Cricket Board, Director of Abahani Limited. Mr. Chowdhury is Former President of Bangladesh Agro Processors Association (BAPA) and Bangladesh Toiletries and Cosmetic Association. Mr. Chowdhury was awarded the National Sports Award 2009 for his outstanding contribution in the sporting arena. He is also well known as a film producer and received the National Film Award 2010 as Best Producer in the year 2011 for his widely acclaimed feature film "Monpura". Mr. Anjan Chowdhury is involved in various philanthropic activities particularly focusing on the sustainable economic and educational development for the underprivileged.



Ms. Rokia A. Rahman Director, MIDAS Board

Ms. Rokia Afzal Rahman is a leading woman entrepreneur and a former Adviser (Minister) to the Caretaker Government of Bangladesh. She started her career in a commercial bank in 1962 when very few women had entered banks universally. She became the first woman bank manager of the country in 1964. In 1980 Ms. Rahman ventured into her own agro based industry and further diversified her business into insurance, media, financial institution, real estate and power sector. She is currently the Chairman of R.R. Group and Arlinks Group of Companies, Chairperson of Mediaworld Limited (owning company of "The Daily Star"). She is a Director of Mediastar Limited (owning company of "Prothom Alo") and Ayna Broadcasting Corporation Limited (FM Radio Station-ABC Radio). Ms. Rokia Afzal Rahman is the current Chairman of MIDAS Financing Ltd. She

is also an Independent Director of Bangladesh Lamps Limited. Ms. Rokia Afzal Rahman is the Vice President of International Chamber of Commerce-ICC Bangladesh.

Ms. Rahman was the Board Member of the Bangladesh Bank. She was the President of the Bangladesh Employers Federation (BEF). She was the Director of Reliance Insurance Limited. She is former President of Metropolitan Chamber of Commerce and Industries (MCCI). She is the founder President of Bangladesh Federation of Women Entrepreneurs (BFWE). In 1994, the first Women Entrepreneurs Association (WEA) was formed in Bangladesh with Ms. Rokia Afzal Rahman as founder President. In 1996 Ms. Rahman formed Women in Small Enterprises (WISE) to further promote women into small enterprises and industries. She received several international and national awards.



Mr. S.M. Al-Husainy Director, MIDAS Board

A person with a brilliant academic career, Mr. S.M. Al-Husainy studied Physics and Electrical Engineering under Calcutta University. He joined public service with the then Government of East Pakistan in 1950. Mr. Al-Husainy's last position in the Power sector under EPWAPDA was General Manager, Power. Under his leadership a very substantial network of transmission and distribution system and generation with capacity of nearly 500 MW was established. In recognition of his contributions to public service, the then Government of Pakistan had awarded him a Tamgha—i-Quaede Azam (TQA) in 1963 and a Sitara-i-Khidmat (SK) in 1969. Immediately after the Independence Mr. Al-Husainy was appointed as a Secretary to the Government in January 1972. He was a Member of the Bangladesh Bank Board for many years, Bangladesh

Biman, Bangladesh Shilpa Bank, Bangladesh. Shilpa Rin Sangstha (the two merged later as BDBL), IPDC. He was the Founding Chairman of SABINCO and Managing Director of Bangladesh Krishi Bank. Mr. Al-Husainy was twice the President of Institute of Engineers Bangladesh (IEB). Mr. Al-Husainy had also been a senior consultant in International Organisations such as ADB, The World Bank, UNDP, UNICEF and UNESCO. He is a founder Trustee of the ESTCDT, the founding body of the Independent University Bangladesh (IUB), the first Chairman of its Governing Council. He was the Former Chairman of MIDAS and Chittagong Independent University. Currently he is the Vice President, National Executive Council of National Heart Foundation. He was the recipient of IEB Gold Medal for professional excellence as well as that of Ahsania Gold Medal for Social Service.



Ms. Parveen Mahmud, FCA is the Chairperson, Board of Governors, Underprivileged Children Education Program (UCEP), Bangladesh. She was the Founding Managing Director, Grameen Telecom Trust and Deputy Managing Director of PKSF. In her varied professional career Ms. Mahmud has been working with social innovations, entrepreneurship and sustainable development at grass- root level. She was a practicing-chartered accountant. Ms. Mahmud was the first woman President of the Institute of Chartered Accountants of Bangladesh (ICAB) for the year 2011, and also the first female board member of the South Asian Federation of Accountants

(SAFA), apex accounting professional body of the SAARC and served ICAB Council for three Director, MIDAS Board terms. She was the Founding Chairperson of CA Female Forum-Women in Leadership Committee, ICAB till 2019 and was the Vice Chairperson of the Women in Leadership Committee of SAFA from 2018-2020. She sits in numerous Boards including BRAC International, Manusher Jonnyo Foundation, PKSF, CPD, TIB, Ghashful, RDRS, Heroes for All, Grameen Health Care Services, DAM Foundation for Economic Development, Cider International School, etc. She is Independent Director of Apex Footwear Ltd. and Director of Berger Paints Bangladesh Ltd. She was the Chairperson of MIDAS, Shasha Denims Ltd., and Acid Survivors' Foundation. Ms. Mahmud was the member, National Advisory Panel for SME Development of Bangladesh and founding board member of SME Foundation. Ms. Parveen Mahmud was the President, Lions Club of Chittagong Parijat Elite, Lions Clubs International, District 315-B4. He was the Chairman and currently is a Member of Board of Trustees of Transparency International Bangladesh. Mr. Khan was the President of Retired Government Employees Welfare Association. He is currently Vice President of Anjuman Mofidul Islam and Chairman of Shujan (Citizens for Good Governance).

Directors' Report

The Board of Directors has the pleasure to place before the Members of Micro Industries Development Assistance and Services (MIDAS) the Directors' Report on the activities of the company for the year ended on June 30, 2022. During the year under report six Board Meetings were held to review the operations and performance of MIDAS and provide necessary policy guidelines to the management.

1. Study and Research

MIDAS undertakes consulting activities regularly for the clients in wide-ranging areas. These include, among others, monitoring and evaluation, design and supervision, industrial project development, business management and marketing. MIDAS also carries out baseline survey, end-line survey, and independent monitoring and evaluation for national and multinational companies, financial institutions, development partners, donors, government organisations, international, local NGOs, etc. During the financial year 2021-22 MIDAS earned BDT 7.95 million as fees for various consultancy assignments, as against BDT 4.83 million in 2020-21.

The following sections briefly provide an account of the various study and research activities undertaken during the financial year.

1.1 Diagnostic Studies to Assess Female Traders and Entrepreneurs Export Potential in the Cut Flower Sub-sector

Ministry of Commerce of Bangladesh Government is implementing a component of Bangladesh Regional Connectivity Project-1 (BRCP-1). The overall objective of this technical assistance project is to strengthen trade related institutional capacity to ensure active and sustainable cooperation among trade related stakeholders and economic empowerment of women traders. BRCP-1 project of Ministry of Commerce contracted MIDAS to carry out Diagnostic Studies to Assess Female Traders and Entrepreneurs Export Potential in the Cut Flower Sub-sector.

Agriculture plays a key role in Bangladesh by contributing 24 percent to its exports, 32 percent to its GDP and employing more than 60 percent of its labour force. Floriculture being an important profitable enterprise is also contributing to this. With the increasing demand for flowers and ornamentals, the floriculture industry has been gaining popularity among the farmers as it gives them relatively more return than rice and vegetable production. At present 10,000 hectares of land is under flower cultivation where approximately 5,000 resilient farmers, many of whom are women, are actively growing flowers and foliage in the country. Different varieties including marigold, tuberose, rose, gladiolus, gerbera and chrysanthemum are being grown commercially. The flower cultivation has export opportunities and introduction of new flowers of high international demand would boost the export potentials of the flower market.

The objective of the study by MIDAS was to conduct diagnostic analysis for the Cut Flower industry to enhance women's role in the export market with a view to making the Cut Flower sector of Bangladesh more efficient, effective and harmonized for trade facilitation.

The primary information required for the study was collected by MIDAS by administering structured questionnaire surveys, conducting Key Informants Interviews and holding Focus Group Discussions in various parts of the country where cut flowers are cultivated, namely, Dhaka,

Gazipur, Narsingdi, Jashore, Chattogram, Cox's Bazar, Chuadanga, Jhenaidah, Natore and Narayanganj. The diagnostic study report prepared by MIDAS presented the findings on the status of production and export of cut flowers, constraints and challenges in cut flower marketing at local and export markets, challenges faced by women entrepreneurs and finally made recommendations to overcome the current situations in enhancing cut flower production and promoting local and export business through increased participation of women.

After successful presentation of the report by MIDAS in a National Dissemination Seminar, the final report was submitted by MIDAS to BRCP-1 of Ministry of Commerce.

1.2 The Study for Exploring the Possibilities of Updating/Upgrading the Expertise/Skills of the Individual Professionals Through Short-term Job Training

Healthcare is highly labour intensive requiring technical knowledge and skills matching with the nature and type of the care and disease pattern for ensuring a healthy life and wellbeing of the people. It is imperative to find ways to ensure healthcare services anytime by the right kind of human resources with right kind of qualifications. One way to ensure services to the people is to train existing human resources by providing short term/on job training and enhance the skills on the particular disease/issues. Therefore, exploring the possibilities of updating/upgrading the expertise/skills of the individual professionals through short-term/on job training is critical in order to deliver healthcare services to the people effectively and efficiently.

Health Services Division under Ministry of Health and Family Welfare of Bangladesh Government assigned MIDAS to undertake this study. The objectives of the study were to undertake a comprehensive analysis of the possibilities of updating/upgrading the expertise/skills of the

individual healthcare professionals through short-term/on job training of both public and private healthcare systems based on the need of the country.

The primary information required for the study were collected by administering structured questionnaire surveys, conducting Key Informants Interviews and holding Focus Group Discussions in randomly selected Districts in all the Eight Divisions of Bangladesh. Respondents were from different levels of healthcare delivery system and different groups of healthcare providers /trainers etc.

The study conducted by MIDAS revealed some limitations in the existing Short Term on The Job Training courses being arranged, like, trainers' competency, module standardisation, supervision procedures, financial allocation, trainee selection, etc. MIDAS research particularly emphasised continuous training module and curriculum development, and regular arrangement of refresher training courses.

After successful presentation of the report by MIDAS in a National Dissemination Seminar, the report was finalised and submitted by MIDAS to Health Services Division under Ministry of Health and Family Welfare.

2. Training

MIDAS provides training services on regular basis mainly in the fields of Entrepreneurship Development, Business Management, Business Plan Preparation, Skill Development, Sales and Marketing, etc. In the year under report the Training Unit earned BDT 1.10 million from the following tasks:

2.1 Investment Readiness Training of HarvestPlus

With International Food Policy Research Institute (IFPRI) as the mother organisation, HarvestPlus started its journey in 2004 in Bangladesh in collaboration with the Bangladesh Rice Research Institute (BRRI) and the International Rice Research Institute (IRRI) to address hidden hunger through biofortification of rice. BRRI succeeded in developing and releasing the first-ever

biofortified zinc rice variety in the world in 2013 through HarvestPlus support. HarvestPlus has partnerships with many Agri SMEs in Bangladesh for promoting biofortified zinc rice in Bangladesh and has been providing various supports to these Agri SMEs for a long time to make them self-sustainable.

As a part of access to finance (A2F) by partner Agri SMEs, HarvestPlus contracted MIDAS to provide Investment Readiness Training to the Partner agri SMEs for a total of seventeen (17) batches in several locations of Bangladesh. A key objective of this training is to build the overall capacity of Agri SMEs to enable them to grow their businesses, access financing from Financial Institution and increase volumes and value especially for biofortified products. Under the Agreement with IFPRI/HarvestPlus, MIDAS conducted the said training courses for six (6) batches in Lalmonirhat, Rangpur, Faridpur, Thakurgaon and Gopalganj Districts during FY 2021-22. The training courses covered three modules, namely, a) Financial Literacy; b) Book Keeping and c) Business Planning and Biofortification. A total of 193 participants (173 male and 20 female) attended the 6 training courses held in 5 Districts as detailed in the following table.


3.3 News Bulletin

7. Future Outlook

South Asian economies are now passing through a tough time in terms of macroeconomic stability. Bangladesh was a little better economically compared to its other South Asian neighbours. However, the country is not fully protected from the common economic challenges that have afflicted other developing countries in the post-Covid period. Pulling up teeming millions of populations from the poverty line would be a daunting task for Bangladesh which is presently fighting soaring inflation and foreign exchange instability. While the global economy was recovering gradually from the COVID-19 pandemic, the war in Ukraine posed a setback to the ongoing recovery. A rise in the global commodity prices and sluggish economic activities by war-induced supply chain disruption are being observed.

Operation and activities of MIDAS are also experiencing the turmoil of ongoing economic instability. MIDAS is basically a promotional organisation in the private sector, set up in 1982 with

the objective of supporting the development of micro, small and medium enterprises on self-sustainable basis. As part of its regular activities, MIDAS offers fee-based business development services to various enterprises and organisations. The market for such services, however, is still largely unstable. Nevertheless, efforts to achieve the objective of the company to promote the development of micro, small and medium enterprises in the country would continue.

In addition, drives to augment the company's revenue by securing multi-year contracts through competitive bidding from the Government and Development partners will also be pursued. As part of its continuous business development efforts, MIDAS has been able to win a Bangladesh Government assignment with Power Cell, Power Division, Ministry of Power, Energy and Mineral Resources. This assignment is expected to be implemented in next FY 2022-23.

Notes to the Financial Statement

For the year ended June 30, 2022

1.00 a. STATUS OF THE COMPANY:

MIDAS operated as a Society under the Societies Registration Act, 1860 to promote and develop micro industries till March 1993. Micro Industries Development Assistance and Services (MIDAS) was incorporated as a Company Limited by Guarantee with the same objectives under Section 26 of the Companies Act, 1913 vide Certificate of Incorporation No. CTO-304 (16)/92 dated December 30, 1992. All assets, liabilities and other obligations as reflected in the society's Balance Sheet as at April 30, 1993 were transferred to the Company on May 01, 1993 in accordance with a vendor's agreement made between the then Society and the newly formed Company on March 29, 1993.

MIDAS is basically a non-profit company and is specifically prohibited to pay any dividend to its members.

b. Objectives of the Company

The main objectives of the Company are to develop and promote micro and small enterprises for the creation of employment on a self-sustainable basis through (i) disseminating information on micro and small enterprises, (ii) carrying out studies and research (iii) identifying innovative projects and potential entrepreneurs for micro and small enterprise development, (iv) offering a package of service including financial assistance, (v) promoting women entrepreneurship and (vi) offering consultancy services for industrial development.

c. Activities of the Company

The activities of MIDAS are conducted through seven Cost Centres viz. i) Project Monitoring, ii) Micro Industries Development Initiatives (MIDI), iii) Study and Research, iv) Information, v) Training, vi) Finance & Administration and vii) Managing Director's Secretariat.

An associate company, named MIDAS Financing Limited, started operation from January, 2000 under licence from Bangladesh Bank and took over the financing activities of the Company. The responsibility of recovering the Project Loans disbursed prior to the take over has been entrusted to the associate company and the costs incurred for monitoring and recovery of the loans are charged to the first two of the above mentioned cost centres.

2.00 SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES:

a. Book Keeping and Accounting System

The book keeping and accounting system of the Company was designed by the consultants appointed by USAID, in accordance with internationally accepted accounting standard and is fully computerized.

b. Convention

The organization prepares its financial statements on historical cost convention under integrated accounting system. The expenses of the Company are charged to the five cost centres.

c. Recognition of Income and Expenditure

Although the accounts of the company are maintained on Bangladesh Accounting Standards (BASs), the Company recognizes its income and expenditure on cash basis.

d. Depreciation

The Company depreciates its fixed assets according to the reducing balance method so as to amortise their values over the useful life of the assets. Depreciation is charged for the whole year irrespective of the date of acquisition. During the year under audit assets were depreciated at the following rates which are consistent with the previous practice:
