Monitoring Structural and Non-Structural Interventions of UNDP's CDMP (Phase II)

The Comprehensive Disaster Management Program (Phase II) is the main vehicle for institutional reform, capacity building and reducing disaster and climate risks in vulnerable communities in Bangladesh. The program is currently working across 12 ministries, 40 districts, 9 city corporations and multiple sectoral partners, including 16 universities and 8 training institutes. Around 50% of total resources are laid with the Local Disaster Risk Reduction Fund (LDRRF), a pooled funds instituted

in CDMP, to finance small to medium scale structural and non-structural interventions at the local level.

Till date, CDMP supported 330 unions of 28 districts with 2 000 risk reduction interventions/ schemes. However, CDMP will be reaching out with new risk reduction interventions/schemes in 500 unions of 40 districts by the end of the project in

To ensure quality of such huge number of schemes implemented across the country, CDMP

engaged MIDAS as a third party for independently monitoring whether the project schemes are up to the acceptable standard in terms of results, process, effectiveness, quality, and accountability of the LDRRF-supported interventions.

For this UNDP signed a professional Service contract for consultancy service with MIDAS. The outcome of the monitoring results will facilitate to design the upcoming CDPM III project more beneficial for the community people.

Quantitative Electricity Distribution Load Studies for USAID's CCEB



SAID's Catalyzing Clean Energy in Bangladesh (CCEB) focuses on strengthening the energy regulatory environment, increasing energy efficiency and promoting clean energy development. The project aims at providing technical assistance to the targeted organizations, small project grants as incentives to promote industrial energy efficiency adoption and training individuals or groups. These efforts will help build institutional and human capacity in regulatory practices and energy business operations to strengthen Bangladesh's ability to make decisions relating to clean energy and reduce Green House Gas (GHG) emissions.

MIDAS signed a contract with Deloitte Consulting Overseas Projects, LLP, USA for

conducting Quantitative Electricity Distribution Load Studies for USAID's Catalyzing Clean Energy Bangladesh (CCEB). During July to August 2013, the study found the present quantitative load and tariff design status of two electric utilities i.e. Paribagh Division of Dhaka Power Distribution Company (DPDC) and Gulshan Division of Dhaka Electric Supply Company Limited (DESCO) of Dhaka City. A questionnaire was jointly developed by CCEB and MIDAS. Twelve Field Enumerators monitored by four Supervisors collected responses from various households, markets, industrial establishments and educational institutions in Paribagh and Gulshan areas. The data collected was uploaded in software for generating statistical tables and parameter calculations. The result of the study is to help USAID's CCEB project to shift the shift able electricity load from peak to off-peak hour by creating awareness among the consumers about the financial benefits of peak and offpeak hour to save energy nationally.
