#### World Development Report 2016:

Under the agreement, MIDAS will conduct a "Baseline Survey for Global Multi-tier Measurement for Access to energy" for Rural Electrification and Renewable Energy Development II (RERED II) Project funded by World Bank. This Type of baseline survey would be carried out for the first time in Bangladesh on access to electricity and improved cooking using the Global Tracking Framework (GTF).

#### Monitoring, Evaluation, Design and Supervision of ASSSRB Project







Agricultural Support for Smallholders in South-Western Region of Bangladesh (ASSSRB) Project of Department of Agriculture Extension, Ministry of Agriculture, Government of The People's Republic of Bangladesh signed a three-year agreement with MIDAS to provide "Monitoring, Evaluation, Design and

Supervision Service for ASSSRB Project". As per the contract MIDAS has been doing independent monitoring, evaluation, design and supervision of ASSSRB project since January 2016 and would continue till June 2018 founded by Islamic Development Bank (IDB). MIDAS Experts are fully responsible for the actions, namely, (a) provide supports to PMU staffs for flawless operations, (b) assist to prepare training materials, consolidated manual work plans and budgets, (c) assist to prepare technical design with specification of infrastructure and equipment related to IDB funded project, (d) assist to prepare tender documents for goods and constructions materials, (e) provide overall specific monitoring and supervision services, (f) assist to prepare regular progress report and submit the same to IDB, (g) help to contract various services and provide direction on baseline survey and studies undertaken by ASSSRBP.

During the period, MIDAS completed two consultancy assignments, titled as above, for Caritas Bangladesh. As part of these assignments MIDAS Team reviewed the project proposal, progress report, customer register books, income/cash register books, operational manual/guideline for ICTs, etc., of all the seven Caritas ICT Centres located in four districts, namely, Dhaka, Munishigonj, Mymensing and Tangail. For this MIDAS team visited all the seven ICT Centres and

carried out interviews and Focus Group Discussion (FGD) with ICT personnel, other key stakeholders and customers of ICT Centres. MIDAS Team also physically observed functions of ICTs and assessed the quality of services, ICT staffs' capacity, documentation system for transparency and accountability, etc. Separate findings of the two studies were shared by MIDAS Team with the field and regional level stakeholders of the project, Caritas Official and donor representatives through a workshop in Caritas Central Office in Dhaka.

#### Feasibility Study of Green Bricks and Block Industries Ltd

MIDAS carried out feasibility study for Green Bricks and Block Industries Ltd (GBBI) of BDG- Magura Group covering organization and management, marketing, technical and financial aspects of the proposed project.

Autoclave Aerated Concrete (AAC) or Autoclaved Lightweight Concrete (ALC) is the perfect construction material to replace and switch from the use of the traditional red clay bricks to environmentally safe bricks for the building and roadbuilding sector in Bangladesh. The traditional way of manufacturing bricks is detrimental to arable land. Production of crops suffers a setback due to excavation of the surface of the earth. In this system, huge fuel is burnt. As such, food security and environment are damaged. The green bricks can be used for construction of high-rise buildings. It will reduce dependence on harmful red bricks for the construction of roof and wall.

Proposed GBBI, which would be the first of its kind in Bangladesh, is planning to manufacture AAC blocks as environfriendly building materials. It is contemplating to gradually replace traditional red clay bricks, production of which is discouraged by the government because of harmful environmental impact of clay bricks.
