Bangladesh Rural Electrification Board (BREB) for the period of September 2014 to April 2015.

MIDAS has already conducted surveys of 15,000 customers using structured questionnaire as well as 60 Key Informant Interviews (KIIs) comprising of domestic consumers, local elites, industrialists, business-persons and public representatives drawn from the particular electric feeders. Due to political unrest the schedule of remaining three Focus Group Discussions (FGDs) out of seven were delayed. Later, the FGDs in Zigatala, Fatullah and Narayanganj were conducted. Currently the final report is being developed.

MIDAS Completes the LDRRF Independent Monitoring of CDMP II, UNDP

In last quarter, MIDAS incorporated recommendations and submitted the final report successfully within deadline on the process of Comprehensive Disaster Management Programme (CDMP) Phase-II, UNDP. CDMP is the main medium for institutional reform, capacity building and reducing disaster risk reduction and climate change impact in vulnerable disaster prone areas in Bangladesh. Under the programme, CDMP expects to reach out with new disaster risk reduction interventions/schemes to 500 unions of 40 districts by the end of the project in 2015.

MIDAS in first phase, MIDAS Independent Monitoring Team prepared and submitted Independent Monitoring Report-1 to CDMP II, UNDP. In second phase, MIDAS Monitoring Team physically verified about 1,500 interventions, conducted 488 KIIs and 48 FGDs in 48 Upazilas of 28 districts. During October to December 2014, a total of 3,319 interventions were physically verified; 98 FGDs and 1,313 KIIs were organized in 42 districts. Moreover, a detailed photo album with location-wise specific interventions was compiled. The findings of MIDAS will facilitate CDMP II, UNDP in designing a plan of action for strengthening the current disaster risk reduction program and future advocacy possibilities to save the lives of human-beings, poultry and livestock.

Technology Transfer

PUM-Netherlands Assistance for Private Sector Development

PUM-Netherlands Senior Experts is a government-supported organization based in the Netherlands. It offers the services of volunteer experts, most of whom are former senior/top level professionals, to help industrial/commercial ventures and social organizations of developing countries. In his visit to Kazi Farms Group he meet with Mr. Zahin Hasan, Director of Kazi Farms Group and discussed about their poultry business and newly established slaughtering house. Mr. Bertus recommended that Mr. A. Nieuwerhuis, the Senior Expert from

Max Foundation, Netherlands based NGO was one of the projects that was supported by PUM. Mr. Bertus went for a follow-up meeting with Engr. Imam Mahmud Riad, the Country Director of Max Foundation. Mr. Jan Oomen, the Senior Expert of PUM-Netherlands had advised him on Fundraising and Organizational Development.

Food Edge Limited

Only a year ago, Bread & Beyond café opened its door selling an expansive collection of pastries and sweets. There are two branches, one in Banani and another in Dhanmondi. The café is still known to just a modest crowd but it has a good number of repeat customers.

Mr. Noor Haque, Managing Director of Food Edge Limited requested assistance from the PUM-Netherlands on bakery and process management. Mr. V. van den Oord, a Senior Expert on Bakery & Confectionery (Project No. 68770 MBJ) visited Food Edge Limited from 27 January to 9 February 2015. Mr. Oord initially made a learning need assessment of the company bakers and staff members. He shared his understanding with Mr. Haque and on priority basis provided hands-on training on seven popular bakery items, modified their production cycle, demonstrated quality control (QC) techniques, packaging and merchandising. He also provided Food Edge advice on exporting their products.



In 2005, the Max Foundation was founded by Mrs. Joke and Mr. Steven Le Poole after the death of their son Max Le Poole. He was only eight months old and died of a rare viral infection. To spare other parents of such deep pain, and give as many children the future that Max did not have, the Max Foundation was established.
