INSTITUTIONAL OVERVIEW

Micro Industries Development Assistance and Services (MIDAS) is one of Bangladesh's pioneering institutions dedicated to fostering entrepreneurship, promoting private sector growth, and advancing micro, small, and medium enterprise (MSME) development. Established in 1982 under the Societies Registration Act of 1860 with the support of the United States Agency for International Development (USAID), MIDAS began its journey with a mission to drive innovation, enterprise, and sustainable business growth across the country. It is also registered with the Department of Social Welfare, Government of Bangladesh, as a non-profit voluntary organization.

The origins of MIDAS trace back to 1981, when a Cooperative Agreement was signed between USAID—under its Rural Industrial Project—and The Asia Foundation, which administered USAID's support. Following its registration, MIDAS received direct assistance from USAID in 1985, enabling it to extend loan and equity financing to promising small and medium enterprises. This initiative marked a major step in MIDAS's evolution into a commercially oriented development institution.

To further strengthen its institutional framework, MIDAS was reconstituted as a Company Limited by Guarantee under the Companies Act of 1913,

following the recommendations of the NGO Cell of the Cabinet Division. The new entity was incorporated on December 30, 1992, and all assets and liabilities were officially transferred from the original Society on April 30, 1993, with the endorsement of USAID.


Recognizing the growing need for enterprise financing, MIDAS established MIDAS Financing PLC. in 1995, in consultation with Bangladesh Bank. Licensed in 1999, MIDAS Financing PLC. began operations in 2000, assuming responsibility for all financial services previously managed by MIDAS. Since then, MIDAS has concentrated exclusively on non-financial services, including business development, consulting, training, and capacity-building initiatives.

Today, MIDAS stands as a trusted and forward-looking institution in Bangladesh's private sector development landscape. It remains steadfast in its commitment to entrepreneurship promotion, MSME empowerment, environmental sustainability, and the integration of ESG principles in enterprise development. Through its strategic programs, research, and advisory services, MIDAS continues to play a pivotal role in nurturing innovation, strengthening business ecosystems, and contributing to Bangladesh's journey toward sustainable and inclusive economic growth.

GOVERNANCE


MIDAS OPERATES A VAST RANGE OF ACTIVITIES UNDER THE GUIDANCE OF ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS

MIDAS operates a wide range of programs and initiatives under the strategic leadership of its Board of Directors. Functioning under the overall supervision of the General Body, the Board is responsible for guiding the organization toward the fulfilment of its Vision and Mission. It provides strategic direction, sets organizational priorities, and ensures that MIDAS continues to operate with integrity, transparency, and accountability. The Board of Directors exercises overall financial and policy control, ensuring that the organization remains on a sustainable and results-oriented path. Comprising twelve (12) distinguished members, the Board brings together vast experience and expertise from diverse sectors to shape the institution's strategic outlook and governance framework.

As stipulated in Article 40 of the Company, all members of the MIDAS Board—except the Managing Director—serve a two-year term and are eligible for re-election for subsequent terms. From among themselves, the Board nominates a Chairman to serve for a one-year period. The Managing Director, appointed by the Board, serves as the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of MIDAS and is responsible for

executing strategic plans, managing operations, and ensuring effective program implementation under the guidance of the Chairman. Through this robust governance structure—anchored by the Board, its Committees, and the Management—MIDAS upholds a culture of professionalism, accountability, and strategic foresight, ensuring its continued leadership in enterprise development and consulting services in Bangladesh.

To further enhance good governance and operational efficiency, the Board has established specialized committees—the Finance and Audit Committee (FAC) and the Human Resources (HR) Committee. The FAC is responsible for overseeing the organization's financial management, internal audit processes, and compliance with regulatory and policy standards, thereby ensuring fiscal responsibility and transparency. The HR Committee, on the other hand, focuses on organizational structure, human capital development, performance management, and policy formulation to foster a motivated, efficient, and capable workforce aligned with the organization's goals.



BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The Board of Directors of MIDAS provides strategic leadership and policy oversight, steering the organization's direction and ensuring effective decision-making. It is responsible for shaping the long-term vision, endorsing key strategic policies, and upholding the principles of sound corporate governance to promote transparency, accountability, and sustainable institutional growth.



Ms. Parveen Mahmud, FCA, serves as Chairperson of the MIDAS Board of Directors. She is also Chairperson of Manusher Jonnyo Foundation (MJF), HerStory Foundation, CholPori Technologies Ltd and Shasha Denims PLC. She is Vice Chairperson, Subarta Trust and Adviser, Bangladesh Federation of Women Entrepreneurs (BFWE). A trailblazing figure in finance, social innovation, and sustainable development, she serves on the boards of CPD, Ghashful, Friendship, Heroes for All, Miner Bondhu and Cider International School. She is an Association member of BRAC and a Board of Trustee, Chittagong Independent University (CIU).

Ms. Mahmud started her career at BRAC, advancing to Deputy Managing Director of Palli Karma-Sahayak Foundation (PKSF). As Founding Managing Director of Grameen Telecom Trust, she spearheaded grassroots initiatives in entrepreneurship and empowerment. A Fellow of the Institute of Chartered Accountants of Bangladesh (ICAB), she etched history as its first woman President in 2011 - the first female Council member, office bearer, and board member of the South Asian Federation of Accountants (SAFA). She completed three terms on the ICAB Council, established the CA Female Forum-Women in Leadership Committee (Chairperson until 2019), and held the Vice Chairperson role for SAFA's Women in Leadership Committee (2018–2020).

Her influence in SME development includes founding the SME Foundation's Board and convening its SME Women's Forum, alongside membership in Bangladesh's National Advisory Panel for SME Development. Previously, she chaired the Acid Survivors' Foundation, RDRS Bangladesh and UCEP Bangladesh. Globally, she contributed to UNCTAD/ISAR's Consultative Group on Social Indicators, mentor at TalentNomics Inc. In civic roles, she led as President of the Lions Club of Chittagong Parijat Elite and first female Cabinet Treasurer of Lions International, District 315-B4, Bangladesh.

Celebrated for her visionary leadership, Ms. Mahmud was awarded the SAFA Lifetime Woman Leadership Award 2025 on September 16, 2025, in Colombo, Sri Lanka, from the SAFA Women in Leadership initiative. Her honours encompass the "Top 50" Global Professional and Career Women Award 2023 from Women in Management Sri Lanka for Leadership in Finance and Accounting; Chittagong Digest Women's Day 2020 Award; Ananyanna Top Ten Women 2018 Award (presented 2019); Joya Alokito Nari 2018 Award from RTV; "Women at Work 2017" Award from BASIS; "Women of Inspiration Awards 2017" from BOLD; and Begum Rokeya Shining Personality Award 2006 from Narikantha Foundation.



Mr. Anjan Chowdhury, a visionary Bangladeshi industrialist and Director on the MIDAS Board, exemplifies dynamic leadership rooted empowerment, precision, and discipline. As a key figure in the SQUARE Group - Bangladesh's leading conglomerate spanning pharmaceuticals, textiles, food and beverages, healthcare, aviation, education, and media - Mr. Chowdhury has driven its expansion to over 31 ventures, employing more than 74,000 people and achieving an annual turnover exceeding USD 2 billion. Born on July 17, 1954, as the youngest son of SQUARE's founder, the late Samson H. Chowdhury, he imbibed an entrepreneurial legacy early on. A graduate in Management from the University of South Florida, Mr. Chowdhury's patriotism shone during the 1971 Liberation War, where he served as a Freedom Fighter with the Bangladesh Liberation Force, training among an elite 13,000 commandos in India. His contributions to national development earned him Commercially Important Person (CIP) status in 2005 and recognition as one of Bangladesh's top taxpayers since 2008.

In his expansive portfolio, Mr. Chowdhury serves as Chairman & Managing Director of entities including Vision Technologies Limited, Sun Communications Limited, Aaram Food and Beverage Limited, and Oracle Travels Limited; Managing Director of Square Toiletries Limited, Square Food & Beverage Limited, Square Air Limited, Maasranga Communications Limited, and Aegis Services Limited; and Director of Square Pharmaceuticals PLC, Square Textiles PLC, Square Hospitals Limited, and others within the SQUARE ecosystem. On the MIDAS Board, he leverages his enterprise expertise to advance MSME empowerment through financial, managerial, and technical support, fostering entrepreneurship incubation, capacity building, and sustainable growth aligned with poverty reduction goals. His broader engagements include Trustee at Independent

University's Education, Science & Technology, and Cultural Development Trust; Chairman of the Society for the Promotion of Bangladeshi Art; President of Annada Gobindo Public Library and the Aviation Operators Association of Bangladesh; Vice President of the Bangladesh Olympic Association; and leadership in the Bangladesh Football Federation, Abahani Limited, and Association of Television Channel Owners.

A passionate advocate for sports, culture, and philanthropy, Mr. Chowdhury has elevated national infrastructure as Chairman of Kurmitola Golf Club's Development and Finance Committees, recipient of the 2009 National Sports Award, and founder of Pabna Pirates FC and CC. In culture, he is an awardwinning film producer, securing National Film Awards for Best Producer in 2010 (Monpura) and 2020 (Bishwoshundori), and established the Dhaka International Folk Fest in 2015, now Bangladesh's premier cultural event. Through SQUARE's initiatives, he supports women's and children's welfare via tollfree helplines, SRHR programs for 3 million RMG workers in partnership with the Government of the Netherlands and SNV, and educational institutions like Square High School and College. As an Advisory Board member of WINGs, his renovations of historic sites and commitment to equity underscore his belief in boundless opportunities for national service, guiding MIDAS and beyond in 2025 toward a vibrant MSME-driven economy.



Mr. Bazlur Rahman Khan serves as an Enterprise Development Specialist and Management Consultant, bringing extensive expertise in financing, training, teaching, consulting, monitoring, and evaluating operations across profitable and non-profit sectors both domestically and internationally. A seasoned educator, he has lectured at numerous universities and institutes.

His distinguished career includes senior management roles at MIDAS, MIDAS Financing Ltd., Glaxo Bangladesh, Bata Shoe, and British American Tobacco. Currently, Mr. Khan holds the position of Managing Director and CEO of Lubricants Asia Ltd., a key affiliate of the Fuchs Group, Germany. He also chairs Agro Industrial Trust, Pride Construction and Development Ltd., and Agro Chicks and Fisheries Ltd., in addition to his prior tenure as Chairman of MIDAS.

Mr. Khan holds an M.Sc. in Mechanical Engineering (specializing in Thermal Power) and a B.Sc. in Mechanical Engineering from the Pakistan University of Engineering and Technology, Lahore, complemented by an MBA from the Institute of Business Administration (IBA), University of Dhaka.



Ms. Sabina Alam, a graduate in English Literature from the University of Dhaka, is a distinguished entrepreneur with over two decades of experience, known for her dynamic leadership and strong commitment to social and economic empowerment.

She currently serves as Adviser to ABC Real Estates Ltd., a leading construction enterprise in Bangladesh. Previously, she held the position of Managing Director of Sky Room Restaurant, one of the country's pioneering high-rise dining establishments.

Ms. Alam is the Vice President of the Bangladesh Women Chamber of Commerce and Industry (BWCCI), where she plays a vital role in promoting women's entrepreneurship and advancing gender-inclusive business policies. She is also an active member of the Zonta Club of Dhaka, contributing to various community development and social welfare initiatives.

Her outstanding achievements and contributions have earned her several prestigious accolades, including the "Priyo Dorshini" Award from the Indian Women Entrepreneurs Association, the "Begum Rokeya Shining Personality" Award from the Narikantha Foundation, and the "International Award for Tourism, Hotel, and Catering Industry" from the Trade Leaders Club in Spain.

Ms. Alam continues to be an inspiring figure in Bangladesh's entrepreneurial landscape, exemplifying excellence, resilience, and a deep sense of social responsibility.



Ms. Zahida Ispahani is a distinguished leader in national social development and corporate governance. She serves as Chairperson of A.B. Ispahani Securities Limited and holds Directorships at M. M. Ispahani Limited, Ispahani Tea Limited, ISPI Securities Limited, The Free School Street Property Limited, ISPI Travels Limited, and The Financial Express. Additionally, she is a Member of the Management Committee at Ispahani Islamia Eye Institute Hospital and previously served on the Executive Committee of Ispahani Girls' School & College.

Beginning her career as an educationist, Ms. Ispahani has made significant contributions to women's empowerment and community welfare. She dedicated six years as Secretary of the United Nations Women's Association in Bangladesh and is a founder member of the SAARC Women's Association in Bangladesh, where she served as Secretary and President for two terms. A committed philanthropist, she has supported numerous orphanages and social organizations, reflecting her lifelong dedication to inclusive development.

Ms. Ispahani is the spouse of the late Mr. Mirza Ali Behrouze Ispahani, former Chairperson of the M. M. Ispahani Group and a Director of the MIDAS Board. She holds a Bachelor's degree in Economics from the University of Punjab, Pakistan.





Mr. Abdul Karim joined the MIDAS Board on February 20, 2017. A retired Secretary to the Government of the People's Republic of Bangladesh, he held distinguished roles across key ministries, including Communications, Defence, and Finance. His public service tenure featured leadership as Member (Finance) and Chairman of the Bangladesh Inland Water Transport Authority; Director of the Bangladesh Small and Cottage Industries Corporation; Managing Director of the Bangladesh House Building Finance Corporation; and Managing Director of the Bangladesh Shilpa Bank.

After over 31 years in government service, Mr. Karim transitioned to MIDAS in December 1992, serving as Managing Director until December 11, 2011. He also led MIDAS Financing PLC. as Managing Director from May 1995 to April 2004 and later as Chairman from August 2024 to June 2025.

Holding a B.A. (Honours) and an M.A. in Economics from the University of Dhaka, Mr. Karim further enhanced his expertise through specialized training in Advanced Accounting, Management Accounting, Public Administration, and Small Enterprise Promotion, both at home and abroad. 

1. STUDY AND RESEARCH

MIDAS continues to offer a diverse portfolio of consulting services to a wide range of clients across multiple sectors. Its core areas of expertise include industrial project development, design and supervision, monitoring and evaluation, business management, and marketing strategy. In addition, MIDAS regularly conducts baseline and end-line surveys, as well as independent monitoring and evaluation assignments for national and international organizations, financial institutions, development partners, donor agencies, government bodies, and both global and local NGOs. These services reflect MIDAS's longstanding commitment to delivering evidence-based insights and strategic solutions that support inclusive development.

During the FY 2024–2025, MIDAS undertook a strategic repositioning of its consultancy operations, focusing on consolidating its service portfolio and identifying new avenues for growth. While no consultancy income was recorded during this period, the organization actively strengthened institutional partnerships, refined its technical frameworks, and aligned its capabilities with emerging national priorities. Compared to earned in consultancy fees during the previous FY 2023–2024, the current year served as a foundation for long-term impact and innovation. With a renewed strategic direction and a proven track record, MIDAS remains well-positioned to deliver high-quality, results-driven consultancy solutions in the years ahead.

1.1. Consulting Services for Surveys and Studies under NSDA (Sector: Creative Media)

In 2024, the Directorate of Technical Education (DTE), under the World Bank-supported Accelerating and Strengthening Skills for Economic Transformation (ASSET) Project, entrusted MIDAS—in collaboration with the National Skills Development Authority (NSDA)—to conduct a comprehensive Labour Market Information System (LMIS) Study for the Creative Media Industry (RFP No. S59A; contract signed on September 26, 2024).

The study covers all eight divisions of Bangladesh and engages 425 respondents across diverse subsectors, including film, music, television, radio (FM and community), advertising, online media, and digital content creation. Employing both quantitative and qualitative methods, the research includes eight Focus Group Discussions (FGDs) and fourteen Key Informant Interviews (KIIs) with a wide range of stakeholders—such as employers, professionals, industry experts, educators, policymakers, and

representatives from DTE.

This initiative aims to assess market potential, employment trends, skill requirements, and the relevance of existing training programs within the Creative Media sector. A key focus is placed on promoting inclusive workforce participation, particularly among youth, women, and underrepresented groups involved in rural digital employment.

Originally scheduled for completion in June 2025, the project timeline has been extended to February 2026 to ensure comprehensive data collection and high-quality outcomes. Upon completion, the study will identify existing and emerging skill gaps, forecast job market trends through 2030, and provide strategic policy recommendations to enhance economic growth, innovation, and employment opportunities within Bangladesh's Creative Media industry.

2. HRD & TRAINING

During the FY 2024–2025, MIDAS continued its strong commitment to capacity building by organizing regular training programs on diverse subjects such as Entrepreneurship Development, Business Management, Business Plan Preparation,

Skill Development, Sales, and Marketing. The organization maintained steady engagement in these areas, achieving notable growth in training activities compared to the previous fiscal year.

2.1 Business Skill Development through Entrepreneurship Training, SCMFP

MIDAS successfully implemented the "Business Skill Development through Entrepreneurship Training" program under the Sustainable Coastal and Marine Fisheries Project (SCMFP), initiated by the Department of Fisheries (DoF) in the coastal and marine regions of Bangladesh under the Ministry of Finance. All project activities were completed within the stipulated timeframe.

The program commenced following an agreement signed on September 1, 2024, with the Sustainable Coastal and Marine Fisheries Project (SCMFP) under the Social Development Foundation (SDF) of the Financial Institutions Division, Ministry of Finance. Funded jointly by The World Bank and the Government of Bangladesh, the training program was designed to strengthen the entrepreneurial and business management capacities of fisheries stakeholders. Its objectives included fostering business growth, improving access to finance, enhancing market understanding, increasing business volume and

value, and building sustainable market linkages.

A total of 975 participants from 20 upazilas across Barisal, Barguna, Bhola, and Patuakhali districts took part in the training. Conducted over seven days, the program featured six days of classroom-based sessions and one day of practical field exposure, allowing participants to gain hands-on experience in small-scale entrepreneurship. MIDAS implemented the training using a customized entrepreneurship development kit, developed in line with the internationally recognized CEFE methodology. The kit covered key topics such as business plan preparation, legal compliance, financial planning, costing, and basic accounting systems.

Additionally, MIDAS facilitated on-site visits to participants' existing enterprises and submitted batch-wise business development reports to the respective regional offices, ensuring the program's practical relevance and sustainable impact on local fisheries entrepreneurship.

2.2 Skill Development and Employment Generation on Micro Entrepreneurship Development under RELI Project

MIDAS is currently implementing the "Skill Development and Employment Generation on Micro Entrepreneurship Development" program under the Resilience, Entrepreneurship and Livelihood Improvement (RELI) Project, initiated by the Social Development Foundation (SDF) of the Financial Institutions Division, Ministry of Finance.

The project began following an agreement between the Social Development Foundation (SDF) and MIDAS for the implementation of entrepreneurship development training aimed at empowering youth to become successful rural micro-entrepreneurs. Jointly funded by The World Bank and the Government of Bangladesh, the program is designed to enhance participants' knowledge, skills, and entrepreneurial mindset to support sustainable income generation and local enterprise development.

Upon completion of each training batch, MIDAS submits a comprehensive Training Completion Report to SDF, reflecting the outcomes and progress of the participants.

This one-month program, held three days per week with three-hour sessions, was designed to enhance the design and business capabilities of participants engaged in clothing and handicraft enterprises.

Led by Bibi Russell, a globally renowned Bangladeshi fashion designer and founder of Bibi Productions, the training provided expert mentorship focused on creativity, craftsmanship, and entrepreneurship.

The initiative addressed key challenges faced by Youth and Women-led micro and cottage businesses,

such as limited access to specialized mentorship, financial resources, business scaling knowledge, and strategic planning. To ensure a productive learning environment, MIDAS provided comprehensive logistical support, including a well-equipped training facility with digital tools, internet connectivity, and essential materials for hands-on practice.

Through this program, Youth and Women Entrepreneurs from diverse sectors—such as clothing, handicrafts, jewellery, and cosmetics—gained practical skills, professional confidence, and valuable networking opportunities. The initiative fostered innovation and self-reliance, contributing to a more inclusive and dynamic entrepreneurial ecosystem in Bangladesh.

Looking ahead, MIDAS plans to deepen its collaboration with local and international partners to introduce specialized technical assistance programs, sector-specific training modules, and innovationdriven consultancy services. These initiatives aim to enhance SME competitiveness, promote technology adoption and support inclusive economic development across Bangladesh.

The growing engagement in technology transfer activities reflects MIDAS's strengthened focus on advancing innovation and expanding its impact within the SME ecosystem.

4. YOUTH & WOMEN PROGRAM

FROM VISION TO VICTORIES — WOMEN SHAPING ENTREPRENEURSHIP

MIDAS has played a pivotal role in fostering approximately 18,000 SME entrepreneurs, of whom 10,750 are women. To support women-led businesses further, MIDAS established the Women Entrepreneurship Development (WED) cell, a dedicated unit that provides tailored business development services, mentorship, and access to resources for women entrepreneurs. This initiative empowers women to navigate the challenges of entrepreneurship and thrive in competitive markets. The following case studies illustrate the journeys and accomplishments of two women entrepreneurs who have leveraged MIDAS's support to build successful ventures.

Case Study 1: Ms. Afroza Sultana Sheuli – From Resilience to Radiance: Crafting Zaarin's Enduring Legacy of Empowerment and Elegance



Born in Chattogram, Bangladesh, Ms. Sheuli grew up in a patriotic and supportive family where her father—a freedom fighter—instilled in her the values of resilience, honesty, and national pride. Her journey, however, was not without hardship. At the age of 17, while pursuing

her Higher Secondary Certificate (HSC) in 1997, Ms. Sheuli was diagnosed with thalassemia, forcing her to temporarily suspend her education. Despite this setback, her determination and inner strength remained unshaken.

After two unsuccessful attempts to establish a business in 2001 and 2010, Ms. Sheuli finally founded Zaarin's Creation in 2015 with an initial investment of only BDT 55,000 and the unwavering support of her husband. Named after her daughter, Zaarin's Creation began as a modest workshop and has since grown into a renowned fashion brand, celebrated for its use of natural dyes and heritage-inspired designs that highlight Bangladesh's rich artisanal traditions.

Through active participation in MIDAS SME Fairs, Ms. Sheuli's enterprise gained significant visibility and recognition. These fairs provided her with an invaluable platform to showcase her distinctive products to a discerning clientele, helping her forge

lasting customer relationships and expand her market reach. A turning point in her entrepreneurial journey came when she met Ms. Parveen Mahmud, FCA, Chairman of MIDAS, whose mentorship and encouragement profoundly influenced Ms. Sheuli's confidence and business growth.

Despite the challenges of competing with imported fashion products, Ms. Sheuli's unwavering commitment to quality, authenticity, and ethical craftsmanship helped her establish Zaarin's as a trusted and admired brand. Today, she manages a small production unit employing 10–12 workers and



caters to clients not only in Bangladesh but also in the USA, Canada, Australia, Japan, the UK, and UAE.

Her achievements have been widely recognized, including the Wonder Woman Award from Tele Solution Bangladesh and the A.K. Fazlul Haque Award for her outstanding contribution to promoting Bangladeshi craftsmanship on a global stage.

MIDAS has played a transformative role in Ms. Sheuli's journey, offering her the exposure, mentorship, and market access needed to turn a modest dream into an internationally recognized enterprise. Today, Zaarin's Creation stands as a powerful symbol of Ms. Sheuli's courage, creativity, and perseverance—proving that with integrity, dedication, and the right institutional support, even the humblest beginnings can blossom into stories of extraordinary success.



Case Study 2: Ms. Asma Ul Hosna – The Story Behind Zadur Hat



Ms. Hosna, a graduate of Jahangirnagar University, left a 14-year corporate in 2021 career pursue her passion for empowering rural women through craftbased entrepreneurship. She founded Zadur Hat, a handcrafted fashion and lifestyle brand in Bogura, Bangladesh, collaborating with

around 20 skilled women artisans to produce batik, dyeing, Nakshi Kantha, Mayer Katha quilts, and sarees made from cotton, khadi, silk, half-silk, and semimuslin using natural dyes.

Her association with MIDAS through the Entrepreneurship Development Training Program was pivotal. The training in business management, branding, and design, coupled with mentorship from Ms. Bibi Russell, strengthened Asma's leadership and artistic vision. MIDAS support helped Zadur Hat evolve from a small local initiative into a social enterprise that promotes sustainable fashion, Bangladeshi craftsmanship, and women's empowerment across Bogura, Sariakandi, Jamalpur, and Jessore.

Today, Zadur Hat stands as a model of inclusive growth and social impact, with Asma aiming to create employment for over 1,000 women and expand the brand globally. Her journey highlights how MIDAS's mentorship and capacity-building initiatives are transforming women's entrepreneurship in Bangladesh, stitch by stitch, story by story.



Case Study 3: Ms. Atika Rahman - The Journey of TE RONGA



Ms. Rahman, aged 54, is the visionary founder of TE RONGA, a brand that has emerged as a shining example of resilience, creativity, and women's empowerment Bangladesh's handicraft sector. Born into family of five members, Ms.Rahman grew up with a strong appreciation for traditional especially nakshi kantha and handloom textiles.

However, like many women of her generation, she faced significant personal and social challenges. After marriage, she encountered restrictions that limited her mobility and prevented her from pursuing employment outside the home. These barriers, combined with periods of serious health complications, created hurdles that could have easily derailed her aspirations. Yet, Ms. Rahman remained determined to utilize her skills and express her creativity through handcrafted products.

In 2002, driven by passion and an unwavering belief in her craft, she began her entrepreneurial journey. Starting on a modest scale, she worked closely with local artisans to produce nakshi kantha, sarees, and home décor items. Although her products were admired for their quality and unique artistic expression, TE RONGA initially struggled with limited visibility, minimal branding, and a lack of structured business practices. After a temporary pause due to personal reasons, Ms. Rahman relaunched her business in 2021 with a renewed

purpose—this time under the formal brand name TE RONGA, symbolizing color, culture, and creativity.

Her turning point came with her engagement with MIDAS, which played a catalytic role in strengthening her entrepreneurial foundation. Through MIDAS's comprehensive training programs—covering fashion design, business management, accounting, entrepreneurship development, and market linkages—Ms. Rahman significantly enhanced her technical and managerial capabilities. The guidance helped her streamline production processes, introduce improved packaging, and access new retail and online platforms. MIDAS mentorship also equipped her to address early operational challenges such as financial constraints, supply chain gaps, and delivery inefficiencies.

Today, TE RONGA stands as a women-led enterprise that not only showcases traditional Bangladeshi craftsmanship but also provides meaningful employment to an all-women team. The brand contributes to improving livelihoods, promoting financial independence among women, and fostering community development. Ms. Rahman continues to expand her business with MIDAS support and aims to establish a dedicated retail outlet, strengthen her online presence, and diversify her product portfolio. She also plans to participate in advanced training programs to scale up production while ensuring the preservation of cultural heritage.

TE RONGA remains a powerful testament to Ms. Rahman's perseverance, creativity, and leadership—demonstrating how targeted support and mentorship can transform potential into sustainable entrepreneurial success in Bangladesh.





Case Study 4: Ms. Maliha Wadud Chandni-Vision, Reinvention, and Community Empowerment



Ms. Chandni embarked on her illustrious career in broadcast media during formative years, audiences captivating as an exceptional young journalist and producer at ATN Bangla. Her pioneering program Amra Korbo Joy secured the prestigious Ammy Award, showcasing her mastery in evocative storytelling-a talent further recognized by

the UNICEF Meena Award in 2016 for elevating children's narratives. Progressing to Senior Journalist in ATN Bangla's News Division, she cultivated her proficiency concurrently with a Bachelor's degree in Media Studies and Journalism from the University of Liberal Arts Bangladesh (ULAB). Her penetrating commentary in Samprotik Deshkaal and Bhorer Kagoj established her as a formidable voice, while an underlying entrepreneurial spirit steadily gained momentum.

This drive culminated in 2013 with the founding of Long Spring, a versatile wall-sticker initiative procured from China via her sister's international channels. Navigating intense media obligations, Ms. Chandni enhanced her capabilities through programs offered by the Bangladesh Small and Cottage Industries Corporation (BSCIC) and the SME Foundation, seamlessly integrating innovation with entrepreneurial strategy. Far from stalling her trajectory, the COVID-19 pandemic catalyzed

remarkable acceleration-market demand intensified, capabilities broadened, and by 2022, Long Spring was positioned for ambitious transformation.

The MIDAS Centre emerged as a cornerstone of this evolution, its SME Fairs providing a dynamic gateway to market engagement, collaborative alliances, and practical knowledge acquisition. A landmark fashion design workshop facilitated by the esteemed Bibi Russell inspired Ms. Chandni's strategic shift to apparel, embedding Bangladeshi cultural motifs within sustainable, artisan-focused collections. MIDAS's robust framework-featuring specialized training, consultative guidance, and executive mentoring-optimized her workflows. These events furnished critical market analytics, fortified brand identity, and expanded product ranges, complemented by the strategic counsel of Ms. Parveen Mahmud, FCA, Chairman of MIDAS, which instilled a dedication to inclusivity, bolstering women's advancement and ecological responsibility.

Such collaboration propelled Long Spring to unparalleled excellence: refined artisanal precision, extended product spectra, and an adaptive mindset that leverages constraints as catalysts. Presently, it exemplifies a leading lifestyle brand, championing native artistry and advancing women creators. Ms. Chandni's evolution-from media vanguard to mission-oriented entrepreneur-embodies steadfast resolve and strategic insight. Fortified by MIDAS's cohesive infrastructure, she has surpassed conventional expansion to catalyze transformative change, motivating Bangladesh's burgeoning cadre of women pioneers and illustrating how precisely calibrated institutional partnerships can convert personal determination into enduring communal value.

Notes to the Financial Statement

For the year ended 30 June 2025

1.00 STATUS OF THE COMPANY:

MIDAS operated as a Society under the Societies Registration Act, 1860 to promote and develop micro industries till April 1993. Micro Industries Development Assistance and Services (MIDAS) was incorporated as a Company Limited by Guarantee with the same objectives under Section 26 of the Companies Act, 1913 vide Certificate of Incorporation No. CTO-304 (16)/92 dated December 30, 1992. All assets, liabilities and other obligations as reflected in the society's Balance Sheet as at April 30, 1993 were transferred to the Company on May 01, 1993 in accordance with a vendor's agreement made between the then Society and the newly formed Company on March 29, 1993.

MIDAS is basically a non-profit company and is specifically prohibited to pay any dividend to its members.

1.01 Objectives of the Company

The main objectives of the Company are to develop and promote micro and small enterprises for the creation of employment on a self-sustainable basis through (i) disseminating information on micro and small enterprises, (ii) carrying out studies and research (iii) identifying innovative projects and potential entrepreneurs for micro and small enterprise development, (iv) offering a package of service including financial assistance, (v) promoting women entrepreneurship and (vi) offering consultancy services for industrial development.

2.00 ACTIVITIES OF THE COMPANY

The activities of MIDAS are conducted through several Cost Centres viz. i) Study and Research, ii) Training, and iii) Finance & Administration.

3.00 BOOK KEEPING AND ACCOUNTING SYSTEM

The book keeping and accounting system of the Company was designed by the consultants appointed by USAID, in accordance with internationally accepted accounting standard and is fully computerized.

3.01 Convention

The organization prepares its financial statements on historical cost convention under integrated accounting system.

3.02 Recognition of Income and Expenditure

Although the accounts of the company are maintained on Bangladesh Accounting Standards (BASs), the Company recognizes its income and expenditure on accrual basis.

3.03 Depreciation

The Company depreciates its fixed assets according to the reducing balance method so as to amortise their values over the useful life of the assets. Depreciation is charged for the whole year irrespective of the date of acquisition. During the year under audit assets were depreciated at the following rates which are consistent with the previous practice:
